ORGANIZATION OF SKELETAL MUSCLE

Muscles are very interesting structures because they are highly organized. To understand how they are organized, it is important to first understand the concept of "bundle." Gather eight pencils, and organize them to make sure that they are even with each other. Put them in your hand and hold on to them. That's a bundle, a bundle of pencils. Muscle cells, muscle tissue, and whole muscles are all comprised of bundles. We'll begin our study of muscle organization by moving from the organization of a single muscle cell to the organization of muscle tissue to the organization of a whole muscle.
