diff-fer /dɪfə/ verb, formal
to be different: How does the film differ from the book?

Difference /ˈdɪfərəns/ noun
1 a way in which one thing is not the same as another: There are several differences between baseball and softball – one is that the ball in softball is bigger and softer. | What's the difference in price between the two cars? | I can't tell the difference between the two dogs (I can't see how they are different from each other). **ANTONYM** similarity
2 make a difference = to have a good effect on a situation: Exercise can make a big difference in how you feel (=change the way you feel in an important way).
3 make no difference = to be unimportant or to have no effect: It makes no difference to me whether your hair is long or short – I like it both ways.

Different /dɪfərənt/ adjective
not the same: My sister and I like different kinds of music. | Ben feels different from most kids at his school, because he doesn't like sports. **ANTONYM** the same
—differently adverb

diff-er-en-ti-ate /dɪfə'renʃi'eɪt/ (A) verb, formal
to know that two things are different from each other: I can't differentiate between the colors red and green; the two colors look the same.

Dig /dɪg/ verb, dug /dɪg/ digging
to make a hole in the ground by moving earth: The kids had fun digging in the sand. | I dug a hole and put the plant in it.
PHRASAL VERBS
dig something into something
to push something hard into something else: She dug her fingernails into my arm.
dig something up
to take something out of the ground: The dog dug up a bone in the backyard.

di-gest /daɪ'dʒest/ verb
when you digest food, it changes in your stomach into a form your body can use: Some babies can't drink cow's milk because they can't digest it easily.
—digestible adjective easy to digest
di-ges-tion /daɪ'dʒestʃən/ noun
the process of digesting food
—digestive adjective relating to digestion
dig-it /dɪdʒɪt/ noun, formal
any of the numbers from 0 to 9: a four-digit number such as 9723
Di-gi-tal /dɪdʒɪtəl/ adjective
1 using a system in which information is represented in the form of ones and zeros: It's a digital camera, so it doesn't have film.
2 giving information in the form of numbers: It is easy for children to read digital clocks.
di-g-ni-fied /dɪɡnɪfaɪd/ adjective
calm, serious, and making people feel respect: The professor was a tall, dignified old man.
di-g-ni-ty /dɪɡnəti/ noun
calm, serious behavior that makes people respect you: Everyone respected her because she always behaved with great dignity.

di-a-gram /daɪə'græm/ noun
a drawing that you make to show what shape or arrangement something has, or how it works: There is a diagram of the engine on the next page.

Dial /daɪəl/ verb
to press the buttons or turn the dial on a telephone in order to make a call: I dialled her number, but nobody answered the phone. **SYNONYM** call
dial: noun
a round flat part of a clock, telephone, or other machine that has numbers on it or that can be turned in order to choose numbers: If you want to listen to a different station, turn the dial on the radio.

dia-lect /ˈdaɪə,lekt/ noun
a form of a language that is spoken in one area: There are many dialects of German.
→ See Thesaurus box at **language**

di-a-logue also **dialog** /ˈdaɪə,lɒg/ noun
conversation in a book, play, or movie: The dialogue didn't sound real – people don't talk like that.

dial tone noun
the sound you hear when you pick up a telephone before making a call

diameter

di-am-e-ter /daɪ'emetə/ noun
a line or measurement from one side of a circle to the other, through the center: The table is five feet in diameter (=it measures five feet across).

di-a-mond /ˈdaɪəmənd/ noun
1 a very hard, clear, expensive stone, used in jewelry: He bought her a diamond engagement ring.
2 a shape with four equal sloping sides, with its points at the top, bottom, and sides
3 a card used in card games, with red diamond shapes on it: the three of diamonds (=a card with three diamond shapes)
4 the area in a baseball field that is inside the four BASES

di-a-per /ˈdaɪpə/ noun
a piece of cloth or paper that is put around a baby's bottom to hold its waste: I think we need to change the baby's diaper (=put on a new one).

di-ar-rhe-a /ˌdaɪə'rɪə/ noun
an illness in which your body waste is liquid and comes out often: I had diarrhea after eating some meat that was not fresh.

di-a-ry /ˈdaɪəri/ noun plural diaries
a book in which you write about the things that happen to you each day: Do you keep a diary (=write in a diary regularly)?

dice /daɪs/ plural noun singular die /daɪ/
two small blocks of wood or plastic with a different number of spots on each side, used in games: She rolled the dice (=threw them onto a surface).

dic-tate /ˈdɪktɪt/ verb
1 to say words for someone else to write down: She dictated a letter to her secretary.
2 to tell people exactly what they must do: You can't dictate how I should live my life!

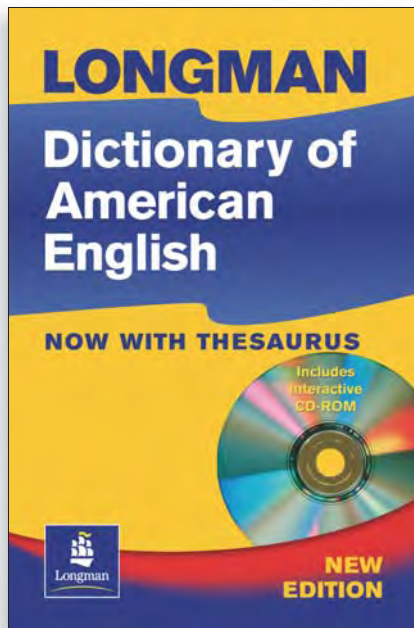
dic-ta-tion /dɪk'teɪʃən/ noun
the act of saying words so that someone can write them down exactly as you say them

dic-ta-tor /ˈdɪktətə/ noun
a leader of a country who has complete power: Dictators often put people who oppose them in prison.
—dictatorship /dɪk'tetʃɪp/ noun
a country that is ruled by a dictator

dic-tion-ary /ˈdɪkʃənəri/ noun plural dictionaries
a book that shows words in ALPHABETICAL order and says what they mean: If you don't know what a word means, look it up in a dictionary (=find the meaning in a dictionary).

did /dɪd/ verb
the past tense of DO

check² n.

1 MONEY [C] one of a set of printed pieces of paper that you can sign and use to pay for things: *a check for \$50* | *Can I pay by check?* | *I wrote her a check for \$300.* | *Did you cash the check* (=get cash in exchange for the check)?

2 EXAMINATION [C] a careful look at or test of something, to see if it is safe, correct, in good condition, etc.: *a security check* | *The building inspector must first do a safety check.* | *I want a check on the quality of all goods leaving the factory.* | *I want you to do/run a check on* (=find out information about) *this blood sample.*

3 CONTROL [C usually singular] something that controls something else and stops it from increasing: *The policy should act as a check on inflation.* | *We've kept/held the disease in check* (=kept it under control) *for over a year now.*

4 BILL [C] a list you are given in a restaurant showing what you have eaten and how much you must pay [= bill]: *Can I have the check, please?*

check-in n. **1** [U] the process of reporting your arrival at a hotel, airport, hospital, etc.: *Passengers should arrive early for check-in.*
2 [singular] a place where you report your arrival at an airport, hotel, etc.: *Be at the check-in counter at least two hours before your flight.* → **check in** at CHECK¹

checking account n. [C] a bank account that you can take money out of at any time

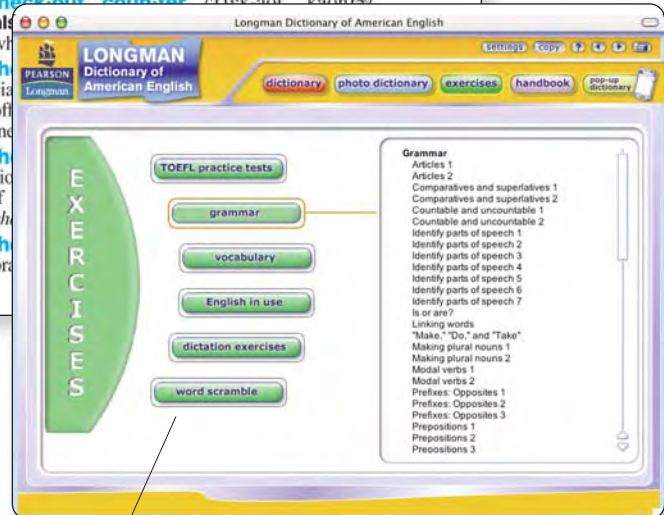

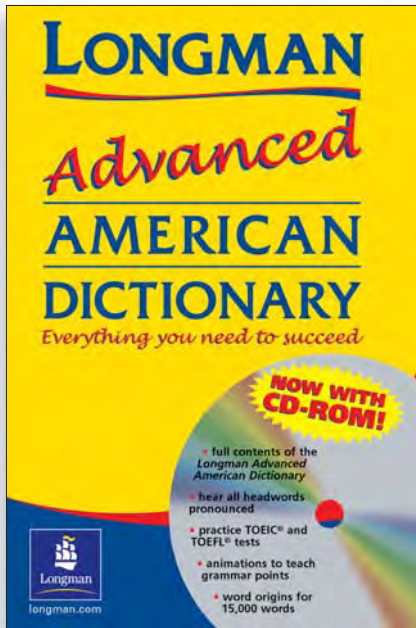

Joe can't hear the phone ringing because he's listening to music.

hear from sb phr. v. [T not in progressive] **1** to get news or information from someone: *Have you heard from Francis at all?* **2** to listen to someone giving their opinion: *We'll be hearing from the new Vice President for finance at the meeting.*

hear of sb/sth phr. v. [T] **1** have heard of sb/sth to know that someone or something exists because you have been told about them: *I've heard of Louis de Bernières, but I've never read anything by him.* **2** Have you ever heard of a band called Big Star? —see also UNHEARD OF

hear sb out phr. v. [T not in passive] to listen to all of what someone wants to tell you, without interrupting them: *Look, I know you're mad, but at least hear me out.*

2 listen to sb/sth [T not usually in progressive] to listen to what someone is saying, the music they are playing etc.: *I heard a great new song on the radio.* | *Jeff, did you hear what I said?* | [**hear sb do sth**] *We went to hear Todd's band play at Mr. B's.*

3 look/looked in [I, T not usually in progressive] to be told or find out a piece of information: *I heard a rumor that Katya was coming back.* | [**hear (that)**] *I heard they did a lousy job on the roof.* | [+ about] *How did you hear about it?* | [**hear sth about sb**] *It's nice to meet you. I've heard a lot about you.* | [**hear what/how/who** etc.] *Did you hear what Tommy's latest idea is?* | *I'm glad to hear (that) your mother's feeling better.* | *"Nice job, her job."* *"Yeah, so I heard."* (=I was told this information before) *Hammell said he heard through/on the grapevine (=found out about something in conversation) that Payne had had a heart attack.* | *I've heard it said (=heard people say) that animals love you unconditionally.*

4 [inquire] hear a case to listen to what is said in court of law, and make a decision: *The case will be heard on July 16.*

SPOKEN PHRASES

5 (do) you hear (me)? said when you are giving someone an order and want to be certain that they will obey you: *Be home by ten, you hear?*

6 I hear you a) used to say that you understand what someone has told you to do and you will obey them: *"The bottom line is we have to finish on time."* *"Okay, I hear you."* **b)** used to say that you agree strongly with what someone just said: *"There's just too much junk on TV these days."* *"Yeah, I hear you."*

7 sb won't hear of it used to say that someone will not do something, even though you think it would be safer or better for them: *I think Clarence should stop driving, but he won't hear of it.*

12 you could hear a pin drop used to say that a place was extremely quiet: *You could hear a pin drop in the auditorium during Norvell's speech.*

13 have you heard the one/joke/story about... used when asking someone if they know a joke: *Have you heard the one about the Norwegian and the Suede at the doctor's office?*

14 I heard that! SPOKEN used to say that you strongly agree with what someone has just said: *"Sneakers have sure gotten expensive."* *"I heard that!"*

15 now hear this! OLD USE used to introduce an important official announcement

16 Heart/Hear said after a speech or in a meeting when you agree with the person who is speaking

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hear sb out phr. v. [T not in passive] to listen to all of what someone wants to tell you, without interrupting them: *Look, I know you're mad, but at least hear me out.*

USAGE NOTE: HEAR

WORD CHOICE: hear, listen

Use **hear** when you mean that a sound comes to your ears: *I heard loud music coming from the room next door.* Use **listen** when you mean you want to hear something and pay attention to it: *I was listening to music when the phone rang.*

hear-er /'hɪə/ n. [C] someone who hears something

hearing /'hɪərɪŋ/ n. **1** [U] the sense which you use to hear sounds: *My hearing isn't as good as it used to be.* —see also HEARD OF HEARING **2** [C] a meeting of a court or special committee to find out the facts about a case: *a public hearing* **3** give sb a fair hearing to give someone an opportunity to explain their actions, ideas, or opinions: *Korb was given a fair hearing by the committee.* **4** in sb's hearing NORMAL if you say something in someone's hearing, you say it where they can hear you: *Don't scold your child in his friends' hearing.*

hearing aid /'hɪərɪŋ/ n. [C] a small piece of equipment that you put in or behind your ear to make sounds louder if you cannot hear well

hearing-impaired /'hɪərɪŋ ɪm'paɪəd/ adj. **1** unable to hear well **2** the hearing-impaired people who are unable to hear well

hear-ken, harken /'hɑ:kən/ v. [I + to] LITERARY to listen

hear-say /'hɪəseɪ/ n. [U] something that you have heard about from other people, but do not know to be true: *Hearsay is not allowed as evidence in court.*

hearse /hɑ:s/ n. [C] a large car used to carry a dead body in a CASKET at a funeral

Hearst /hɛəst/, **William Ran-dolph** /'wɪljəm 'rændəʊl/ (1863-1951) a U.S. businessman who owned many popular newspapers

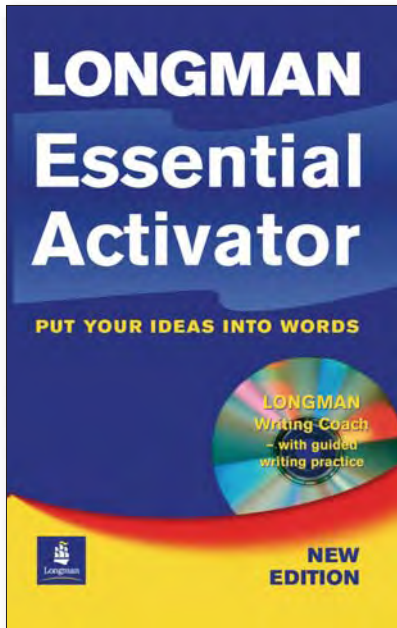

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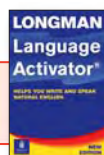

Formal or informal?
 Don't say 'very excellent'. Just say **excellent**.

Formal or informal?
Excellent sounds rather formal in spoken English.

marvellous/wonderful/fantastic /ˈmɑːvələs, ˈwʌndəfʊl, fænˈtæstɪk/ [adj] very good in a way that makes you feel happy or excited: The kids had a marvellous time at the carnival. | You get a wonderful view of the mountains from here.

Formal or informal?
 Don't say 'very marvellous/wonderful/fantastic'. Say **absolutely marvellous/wonderful/fantastic**.

amazing/incredible /əˈmeɪzɪŋ, ɪnˈkredɪbəl/ [adj] very good in a surprising and exciting way: Standing there on top of Mount Fuji was an amazing experience. | What a goal! That was incredible!

Formal or informal?
 Don't say 'very amazing/incredible'. Say **absolutely amazing/incredible**.

brilliant /ˈbrɪljənt/ [adj] BRITISH SPOKEN extremely good: You should come to the new sports centre – it's brilliant.

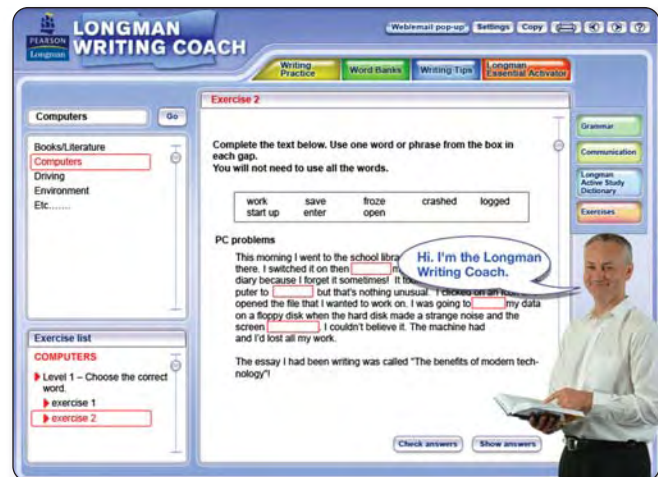
