Frog Museum Münchenstein This museum is in Münchenstein, Switzerland and is for real frog lovers. No, there aren't any live frogs jumping around, but there are over 10,000 frog objects. There are frog lamps, shoes, clocks, cups, umbrellas and much, much more. Take home a frog t-shirt as a souvenir.

The National Museum of Pasta Foods This is a serious museum all about pasta. There's information about its history and exhibits of machinery for making pasta. There's also a library of books about subjects like the changes in the cooking of pasta over hundreds of years. For fun, you can see photographs of famous people eating plates of pasta. Naturally, this museum is in Italy--in Rome, to be exact.

The Cumberland Pencil Museum This museum in Keswick, England, has exhibits about pencil making, the history of pencils, and machinery for making pencils. There are also video shows on pencil making and using the pencil in art. Go to this museum to see the longest pencil in the world; it is 7.91 meters long and weighs 446.36 kilos.

Volkswagen Model Museum This museum in Germany has 6,000 models of Volkswagen Beetles. Learn about the history of this popular car, from its earliest 1938 model to the more modern 2000 one. See the Beetle, for example, as a toothbrush, a letter opener, and as a butter dish.
