

# GUIDED WALK

## A Speaking Activity Using Imperatives

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE TEACHER

In this activity, students will use imperatives to guide their partners. If you have a lot of students, the classroom may be too crowded to carry out this activity successfully. You may want to use the hallway or an outside courtyard.

Before you start, write the following commands on the chalkboard and review them with your students:

Stand up.

Turn right.

Turn left.

Turn around.

Walk toward \_\_\_\_\_ (*the blackboard / the teacher's desk . . .*).

Walk straight ahead \_\_\_\_\_ (*five (big or little)*) steps.

Open the door.

Sit down.

Sit next to \_\_\_\_\_.

Give these instructions to your students:

1. Find a partner and sit down next to him or her.
2. Decide who will be Student A and who will be Student B.
3. Student A: think of a place inside (or near) the classroom. Don't tell your partner what it is!
4. Student A: stand up. Give directions to your partner to guide him or her to the place you have thought of. Use the directions you have just reviewed with your teacher. It is very important that you give clear directions!
5. When Student B reaches the correct place, Students A and B switch roles.
