The history of cinema

Cinema is the major art form of the 20th century. The first moviemakers experimented with sound, but movies were silent until 1927. One of the earliest movies, *The Great Train Robbery* (1903), was also the first western. It lasted just ten minutes.

The history of Hollywood began when a group of movie producers moved to the Los Angeles suburb just before World War I. They started the most important studio and turned it into a million-dollar business. Movie producers and directors originally moved to Hollywood because of the pleasant climate and wide-open spaces. It is still a major center for moviemaking.
