The Mandarin language

Mandarin is the official language of the People's Republic of China. Most Chinese people living in northern and southwestern China are native speakers of some dialect of Mandarin. In fact, Mandarin is spoken by over 720 million people in China; that is, 70 percent of the population. There are also many Mandarin speakers in other countries, such as Taiwan, Singapore, and Malaysia. The total number of speakers in the world is probably around a billion, but no one knows for sure. In any case, more people in the world speak Mandarin than any other language, including English.

The grammar of Mandarin is not especially complicated. Compared to other languages, Mandarin word structure is simple and uncomplicated, with words consisting of one or two morphemes. But the writing system is more complex and has little relation to the spoken language. It is based on written symbols or characters that are over two thousand years old. There are around 40,000 different characters — that is a lot to learn!

Today more and more people are interested in learning Mandarin. This is because China has opened its doors to the West and there are many business opportunities for European and American companies. Perhaps in the future, Mandarin will take the place of English and become the language of international communication. So start learning now!
