Keeping yourself safe on the Internet

The Internet can be a lot of fun, but you should take some precautions.

E-mail

Computer hackers can access your personal e-mail, so never use e-mail to give important information such as passwords. In addition, many computer viruses have traveled through documents attached to e-mails, so never open files or documents unless you know the person who sent it. Finally, beware of "spam"—unwanted advertisements. If you have already downloaded "spam blocker" software, you will get less spam.

Chat rooms

Many chat rooms have been designed for young people. However, some of the people using them may not be kids, but adults who are not very nice people. To keep safe, always use a nickname; never use your real name. Never give any personal information like your address, phone number, family details, or even your e-mail address. Never send photos of yourself or where you live. If someone has made you feel uncomfortable, sign off and tell your parents about it.

Your health

When you have logged on, make sure you have a comfortable chair and get up and move around often. The Internet is a great way to surf for interesting websites, find and exchange information, and talk to friends, but you shouldn't spend too much time there. Every day, make sure you have also gotten out, exercised, played in the fresh air with your friends, and spent time with your family.
