### Listening Strategies

#### Taking notes about historical information

Taking notes while you listen will help you remember the key ideas. You can use abbreviations in order to write notes more quickly. It is common to abbreviate longer words with the first syllables or with initials.

<u>Some common abbreviations</u>	<u>Some abbreviations of longer words</u>
e.g. = for example	Eur = European
i.e. = in other words	conserv = conservative
vs. = in contrast to	soc = social
C = century	pol = political
yrs. = years	S.Y. = Susan Yigal
17 <sup>th</sup> = seventeenth	
21 <sup>st</sup> = twenty-first	
/ = and / or
