### TEACHER'S NOTES:

#### Module 11 The world around us

**Aim:** For students to use the Internet to do research about animals in London Zoo. This worksheet leads on from the topic of the module, which has focussed on the animal world.

**Time:** 45 minutes

**Materials:** Photocopies of the worksheet for each student.

1. Students decide which of the animals they would normally find in a zoo.
2. Tell students that they are going to look at a website about London Zoo. Check that students have opened the main page correctly and that they have opened the **Meet the animals** section.
3. Students look at the different types of animals and choose one of each type (mammals, birds etc.) they would be interested in seeing. Students complete the table with the information about the animals they have chosen. In the section **Animal facts**, tell students to find one piece of interesting information about each animal.
4. Students tell their partners about the animals they are interested in seeing and explain why they would like to see these animals.
