- 5 Return to the homepage and click on ***international students***: how many international students are there?
- 6 Give two reasons that are listed for international students to study at UEA? Are these good reasons?
- 7 Return to the homepage and click on ***learning at UEA***: how many academic departments are there?
- 8 Return to the homepage once again and click on ***sport for all***: name five of the sports classes on offer for students.

TEACHER'S NOTES:

Going on to uni...

Aim: to use the internet to explore the topic of learning – specifically a UK university website. This worksheet is designed to be used in conjunction with unit 11.

Time: 40 minutes

Materials: photocopies of the worksheet for each student.

- 1 Make sure all students are on the correct website. Ask students if any of them want to go to university in the UK (or The States). Then direct students to answer the questions. Monitor, and help where necessary, to check that student are finding the right information. Elicit answers.

Answers: [Correct at the time of going to press] 1 five to seven years
2 Students' own answers 3 Yes, there is. 4 three; BA in film and TV studies, BA in film and English studies, BA in film and American Studies
5 2,000 from 120 different countries 6 low crime rate and low rainfall in Norwich (+ the most liveable city!) 7 eighteen academic departments called Schools of Study 8 Any five from; tennis, Pilates, trampolining, yoga, fencing, squash, swimming

- 2 This is a chance for students to freely explore in a little more depth an area that has interested them, e.g. finding out more about the sport side of things, being an international student. Monitor closely to check they don't get into any difficulties with language. Ask students to explain why they have chosen the answers they have.
- 3 Ask students to compare their answers in pairs. Find out how many of them would like to study at UEA as a class activity, and get students to explain why. How is the university different from the ones in their country/countries?
