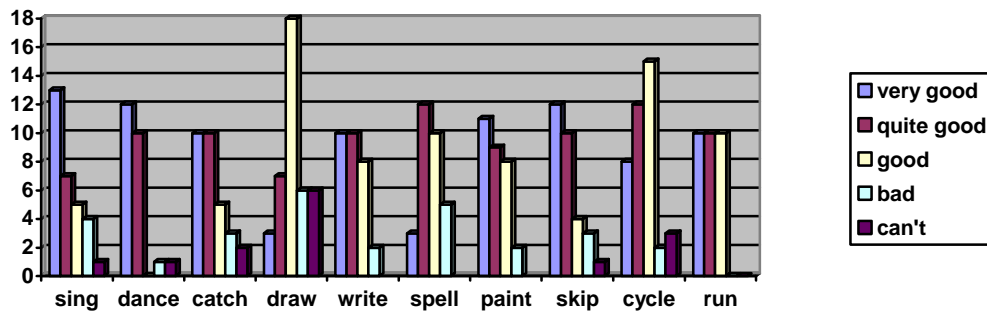

## Teacher's notes

### Good at doing (Young Learners)

- 1) Introduce the verbs. Most will be known but a few may be new for the learners. Use mime and pictures to introduce each activity. Encourage the children to flip through their textbooks and picture dictionaries to find the pictures.
- 2) Write the exchanges on the board and practise with the different verbs from Exercise 1. Learners must learn to listen to the question (Are you / Can you) to get the correct form of the response.
- 3) Use Paula's reading text to introduce the idea of gradation of ability – from 'very good at' to 'very bad at'.
- 4) Practise the question form and the different responses. Let the students practise in pairs.
- 5) When the learners are fluent with the questions and responses, show them how to make a chart like the one illustrated. Then let them move around the class collecting information to complete their charts.
- 6) When the learners have collected all their information, teach them how to present their results in a histogram (bar chart) as in the example.

#### Optional Extension

- 7) With a good class, show them how to present their information in sentences.  
Thirteen learners in my class are very good at singing.  
One learner in my class can't sing.
